





The service undertakes to protect individual privacy in respect of health information.




COMPLAINTS

THE SERVICE


Maori Mental Health Services provide a range of interventions for adult tangata whaiora who are living in the rohe of Tamaki Makaurau via two specific teams, Kapua Awatea, a place of new dawning, and Maioha Tupuranga, welcoming of new growth.


All interventions in the services are founded in Maori models of health e.g. Te Whare Tapa Wha, Te Wheke and use ti-kanga processes from waewae tapu to whanau.

Maori mental health services are community based and located within the marae – Whatua Kaimarie along with appropriate cultural facilities including the wharenui— Manawanui and the wharekai— Rangimarie.

The services have access to Kaumatua and other people with knowledge of ti-kanga Maori, clinical expertise and relevant life experiences. The service is composed predominantly of Maori staff from a variety of iwi (tribal affiliations).

KAPUA AWATEA





Maori specific interventions and therapy include; kaumatua advice/guidance, powhiri, Karakia, whai korero, mihi, Kapa Haka, Mau Taiaha, Wai Ora—Aqua Aerobics, Hauora Tinana—Touch Rugby, Maorioke and "The Incredible Years" - parenting programme.

Kanohi ki te kanohi (face to face) support or advocacy in accessing community services e.g. WINZ, HNZ, GP'S, Dentist.

These interventions are provided by:

- Kaumatua
- Maori community support workers
- Clinical psychologist
- Occupational therapist.

Eligibility criteria

- Adults
- Current service user of an ADHB community mental health service.

MAIOHA TUPURANGA

This is a Maori intensive packages of care service provided in partnership with a Maori NGO provider Te Kotuku Ki Te Rangi. This service provides:

Specialist needs assessment for Maori, Turanga and Tupurea Aromatawai

Comprehensive recovery planning

Maori specific interventions and therapy (see Kapua Awatea) that support social inclusion.

Kanohi ki te kanohi (face to face) support to access community facilities or services towards social inclusion.

These interventions are provided by;

- Kaumatua
- Consultant psychiatrist and psychiatric registrar
- Social workers
- Nurses
- Occupational therapist
- Clinical psychologist.
