- Remove the pad from your eye next morning yourself
- Start Pred Forte and Chloramphenicol eye drops as instructed right away
- Do not use any other glaucoma drops in the operated eye
- Attend your appointment at the Eye Clinic at Middlemore Hospital / Module 6 Manukau SuperClinic™ (Cross off whichever not applicable) as per appointment letter given to you



After your operation you may experience

- Blurred vision for a week or two
- A blood shot eye for a week or two
- Variable amounts of pain or discomfort for several days

Advice

- Do not rub or touch your eye that has had surgery
- Avoid strenuous activity for two weeks: sports, heavy lifting, prolonged bending
- You may watch TV or read
- Check with your eye specialist when you can drive again

You must contact us if you experience any of the following:

- Severe pain, or worsening pain
- Sudden loss of vision
- Sticky discharge from the eye
- The drainage "bleb" created by this surgery has a low risk of getting infected, even years after the surgery. If your eye suddenly becomes red and definitely painful (more than uncomfortable), or if it is producing sticky discharge, you need to see your eye doctor very soon

Take 2 Paracetamol (Panadol) tablets for pain relief. Do not take more than 4 doses in 24 hour period.

How to use your Eye Drops:

- Wash your hands before use
- Read the label
- Sit in a comfortable chair
- Tilt your head back looking upwards
- Pull down gently on the lower lid
- Squeeze 1 drop into the space between the lower lid and the eye without letting the dropper touch the eye
- Close your eye for about 30 seconds
