ACC Living My Life

The Living my Life service is a disability support service delivered by Te Ahi Kaa to ACC clients who have a long-term disability because of an injury.

We work with kiritaki and their whānau to support them in making decisions about where they live, where they go, who they go with and what they do. Some examples are; increasing the client's independence, meaningful engagement and participation in the local community and increasing the client's achievement of personal, community and employment goals.

Kaumātua Harm Prevention

Our Kaumātua Harm Prevention service ensures that older people experiencing or at risk of experiencing (or perceived to be experiencing) abuse and neglect have timely access to appropriate local services that respond to ensure their immediate safety and support them to have greater control over their lives.

ACC Navigation

The Navigation Service was set up to give the public free, independent advice or guidance if they find the ACC system difficult to navigate.

We encompass the Northern Waikato, and Franklin regions, serving individuals of diverse backgrounds and ages. Our objective is to provide kiritaki with the information and support necessary to access the entitlements they rightfully deserve.

Kia Piki Te Ora

We support and awahi whānau who are experiencing suicidal thoughts and behaviours and deliver a community-led health suicide prevention service.

This service informs, responds and supports you, whanau and community with positive information and practical supports to preventing suicide.

ACC Rongoā

ACC now recognise Rongoā Māori as the traditional healing means used in Te Ao Māori, which includes plant-based remedies, spiritual, and physical therapies.

We work alongside them to provide a range of Rongoā Māori methodologies, including (but not limited to):

- Mirimiri (bodywork)
- Whitiwhiti Kōrero (Listening and Verbal Support)
- Karakia (prayer)

If you suffer an injury you are entitled to free Mirimiri services if you have an ACC Claim. Contact ACC with your claim number ready and request for Rongoā services to be added.
