Kia Ora,

This letter is intended to support people seeking a GP referral to access gender affirming healthcare. Auckland Sexual Health Service (ASHS) provides a regional service for adults (≥18 years) wanting medical affirmation.

There is a dedicated e-referral option for transgender health. These e-referrals are triaged by ASHS and younger clients are forwarded to the Centre for Youth Health. Please note there is an overlap in the ages seen by both services with Centre for Youth Health seeing up to age 20 years in Auckland and Waitemata DHBs and up to age 25 years in Counties Manukau DHB.

Please note that the Ministry of Health patient registration guidelines state that people have the right to have their preferred name (first name) and self-identified gender recorded on their medical records (some patients may wish to describe their gender in ways other than male and female). ASHS aims to work in partnership with Primary Healthcare to provide excellent healthcare support for transgender, non-binary and gender diverse people. Virtual consultations via e-referral are an option should there be any queries about my care once I am discharged back to primary care.

There is support available for the prescribing and monitoring of hormonal therapies in primary care as follows:
